Incident Narrative:

On June 24th 2016 in support of an active incident on Interstate 66 East over Broad Run Creek- Warrenton Volunteer Fire company units Rescue Squad 1 and Tower 1 were requested to respond for a pickup truck over and off the interstate bridge, and into an embankment with entrapment which is classified as a below grade rescue. Primary units from The Plains and Marshall with staff from the Department of Fire and Rescue Emergency Management (DFREM) responded and began initial scene stabilization and extraction of the occupant. WVFC units arrived and assessed the situation further. Because of the location and terrain, a stokes basket aerial operations was used to bring the patient back up to the roadway. Crews below were finalizing extraction of the occupant while crews above setup for the technical rescue.

WVFC crews split into a Rescue Team (Rescue Squad) and Recovery Team (Tower). They established the rope and patient packaging systems and affected the rescue in the course of 25 minutes. This option provided the safest, quickest and least impact to the patient's injuries rather than trying to navigate the steep embankment or finding an alternate off road access from below. Which also saved precious time from the scene to a trauma center. As expected and trained to do, all the involved personnel worked diligently and effectively to remove the seriously injured occupant as quickly as possible. This type of technical rescue is very low frequency, but extremely high impact requiring specialized training and equipment.

This incident is yet another example of our personnel working well together, thanks to adequate training and the proper equipment to respond to the situation. Because of the personnel's' outstanding and exemplary performance, please accept this nomination for recognition of valor for those personnel listed above.

Thank you for taking the time to recognize and honor our professional and dedicated personnel.

It is my pleasure to nominate Detective Sergeant Timothy Carter for the *Meritorious Award*. Sergeant Carter has been employed by the Warrenton Police Department for 25 years, and has been a supervisor for 20 years. Sergeant Carter is assigned to the Support Services Bureau where he supervises all Detectives. Sergeant Carter has demonstrated exceptional leadership, skill, and professionalism on a consistent basis. He is an innovative and thorough investigator that brings a great deal of experience and knowledge to our Investigations Section.

In June 2016, Sergeant Carter was contacted by the Fauquier County Commonwealth Attorney's Office in reference to a sexual assault that was reported to their office directly by the victim. Sergeant Carter assisted with the interview of the victim who claimed that she was assaulted during a meeting. Sergeant Carter spent countless hours investigating the case. His hard work and perseverance ultimately paid off with other victims coming forward with similar allegations. Ultimately, Sergeant Carter was able to close these cases, which resulted in a conviction and active jail time for the suspect.

Sergeant Carter continually shows this type of effort in every case that he is assigned. This type of commitment is also reflected in an embezzlement case that he was assigned to investigate in early 2016. In this case, a large sum of money was embezzled over a number of years by a local community volunteer. Sergeant Carter again spent hours going through records to ensure a strong case and a conviction.

Sergeants Carter's service to the Town has been exemplary as he has risen through the ranks during this time from Officer to Corporal to Sergeant. He is also a graduate of the Virginia Forensic Science Academy. His service and dedication are why he is being recognized for this award. Sergeant Carter is an important contributor to the success of the Warrenton Police Department and is well respected by his fellow officers and the community he serves. It is my pleasure to nominate Officer Carl M. Ferguson for the *Life Saving Award*. Officer Ferguson has been employed with the Warrenton Police Department for one year, and has a total of 22 years of law enforcement experience. He is assigned to the Operations Bureau as a Patrol Officer and has demonstrated exceptional skill and dedication to the Warrenton community.

In May 2016, while in Field Training, Officer Ferguson observed an unconscious person on a sidewalk during his patrol. Officer Ferguson recognized the person was not breathing and had no pulse. He immediately initiated Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation. Within a few minutes, the individual was revived and became coherent as Emergency Medical Service (EMS) personnel arrived on the scene. Had Officer Ferguson not responded expeditiously and administered lifesaving measures, death would have been imminent.

Officer Ferguson's actions reflect positively on the community we serve and exemplify the highest traditions of law enforcement. We are proud to submit his nomination to the Fauquier County Chamber of Commerce Valor Awards Committee.

Sergeant Dodson is assigned to the Operations Bureau and supervises a squad of officers. As a supervisor, Sergeant Dodson has demonstrated exceptional leadership, skill, and professionalism on a consistent basis.

In August 2016, Sergeant Dodson supervised the expedient response to a high priority incident that involved a person inside a residence who had indicated he had murdered a family member, and was threatening to kill himself. Sergeant Dodson coordinated a tactical response upon arrival by establishing an inner and outer perimeter, command post, staging area, and a coordinated response and deployment of arriving personnel and assets. Sergeant Dodson also planned for medical assets and directed all aspects of the operation. Sergeant Dodson's efforts led to the identity of the reporting party, and an investigation that revealed everyone was safe, and no one had been injured. Sergeant Dodson's immediate response and thoughtful decision-making ensured the safety of everyone involved and a successful outcome.

Fauquier Chamber of Commerce 2017 Valor Award

We would like to nominate Senior Trooper Derek J. Mabie for the 2017 Fauquier Chamber of Commerce Valor Award. On two separate occasions this year the actions of Senior Trooper Mabie were crucial to the survival of the victims involved.

In December while off duty, Senior Trooper Mabie was returning home when he noticed something in the tree line just down from his home that seemed unusual. He turned around to investigate and found a victim of a motorcycle accident unconscious lying down an embankment.

It appears that the victim had hit some loose gravel in the road and slid down the embankment. Senior Trooper Mabie was able to stabilize the victim's neck and head to prevent further injury. This proved crucial as a fractured vertebra in his neck and a tear in his spleen were found when the subject was transported to the hospital.

Senior Trooper Mabie was able to call for more advanced medical care. The victim is on the road to recovery thanks to the efforts of Senior Trooper Mabie. If he did not turn around that day, the victim may have not been found in a timely manner due to the location.

Senior Trooper was able to provide his assistance in a life or death situation once again in January 2017. After fueling his vehicle at the 7-Eleven in Marshall, he noticed an elderly man face down on the concrete in front of the store. With no hesitation he attempted to revive the person. He started CPR and notified emergency services of the problem. He continued CPR. After about a minute of CPR the victim started to breath. A rescue unit took over care for the victim and he was transported to the hospital. The victim was an employee of the 7-Eleven. Senior Trooper went out of his way to make contact with the victim's family and kept them apprised of the situation every step of the way.

Like the first victim, this victim is on the way to recovery. If it had not been for the quick actions of Senior Trooper Mabie on both occasions the results may have proved fatal. Senior Trooper Mabie's actions on both occasions exemplify his willingness and dedication to protecting and serving the public while both on and off duty. The Virginia State Police is proud to have Senior Trooper Mabie among its ranks and feel he is well deserving of this award.

Senior Trooper Mabie was assigned to Area 12 after his graduation from the State Police Academy in 2004. He was promoted to Senior Trooper in 2015. Trooper Mabie has been a volunteer with the Front Royal Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department for 17 years and is the Assistant Fire Chief. He is also a Youth Director at his church, and he and his wife Amber are busy raising their family in Linden, VA.

1) *Awarded to: Detective Candyce Shaw and Detective Justin Schmitt*

For their meritorious actions while investigating predators soliciting children using social media.

Detective Candyce Shaw worked online to identify child predators in the Fauquier County area or those willing to travel for the purpose of child sexual exploitation. Four

Virginia men, from Mechanicville, Amissville, Vinton and Warrenton responded to a location in Fauquier County where they believed they were meeting an individual to have sex with children. One individual in particular was already a violent offender and on the VA sex offender registry.

Detective Shaw worked on these cases at night, on weekends, holidays AND while she was pregnant.

Once it was determined an individual was willing to meet in Warrenton, Detective Justin Schmitt stepped in and took the lead organizing the take-down and arrest of these suspects. A public but discrete location was selected and Detective Schmitt coordinated the surveillance and arrest teams. He also completed the operation plans, the briefings and coordinated the take-down and arrests. Although the arrest of these four suspects took place in a public but discrete setting, each incident was executed and with little or no notice by other civilians present. Each arrest was effected efficiently, professionally and without incident due to the detailed planning, surveillance and briefings conducted and coordinated by Detective Schmitt.

Detective's Shaw and Schmitt also conducted post-arrest interviews of these suspects, with the assistance of other detectives and gained valuable information and statements.

As a result of their hard-work, professionalism and determination, these four individuals were charged with attempted indecent liberties with a child under the age of 15 and using a communication system or other electronic means for the purpose of procuring the use of a minor.

2) Awarded to: Sergeant John Sealock, Detective John Thorpe and Detective Jonathan Waddell – Special Operations Unit (SOU)

These detectives are being recognized for their perseverance, determination and professionalism while making significant progress in the fight against heroin abuse and addiction.

These detectives are assigned to the Special Operations Unit (SOU) where they are committed to the suppression of organized crime, narcotics and vice violations in any form within Fauquier County. Their combined efforts resulted in 133 felony arrests during the 2016 calendar year.

While working their way through the apprehension of local distributors of heroin, they identified a dealer with narcotics sources beyond Fauquier County. This case led to a search warrant at this dealer's residence resulting in the largest seizure of heroin (100 grams) and cash (\$180,000) in the history of Fauquier County Sheriff's Office. Further investigation revealed the heroin being sold was coming from the Washington DC area. This led to the arrest of two additional subjects who transported additional heroin into Fauquier County for sale.

The following deputies are being recognized for their quick responses to the recognition of overdose symptoms and the immediate deployment of a lifesaving drug.

Opioid overdoses have increased to an alarming rate resulting in unrepresented numbers of deaths or serious side effects. Opioids include heroin and prescription pain pills like morphine, codeine, oxycodone, methadone and Vicodin. When a person is overdosing on an opioid, breathing slows down or stops and it is very hard to wake them from this state. Brain damage can occur within only a few minutes as the result of a lack of oxygen to the brain. It is imperative to give help to an overdosing person immediately, minutes can make the difference between life and death.

In these cases all of the victims were unresponsive exhibiting signs advanced opioid overdose with shallow breathing, flushed skin and blue extremities. The critical intervention by administering Narcan saved these lives and allowed for further medical treatment.

On Sunday, February 19, 2016 MDS Shane Jacobs responded to a Cardiac Arrest. Upon his arrival he found a 94 yr. old female unresponsive on the floor while a care-giver was providing CPR. MDS Jacobs attached the AED to the victim and administered one shock. MDS Jacobs continued to perform CPR until he was relieved by MDS Alex Armstrong. The victim was subsequently transported to Fauquier ER where the victim was admitted to the IOU with a pulse and blood pressure.

2) Awarded to: Corporal Cackowski, MDS Kevin Jacobs and Deputy Rannenbarger

On August 19, 2016, the attention of these deputies was directed to the Jail's work release dormitory where they found an inmate

unresponsive and not breathing. While awaiting the arrival of rescue, these deputies took immediate action and began life-saving measures.

Shortly after CPR was begun, a pulse was located and the rescue breaths were continued until the arrival of rescue personnel. The inmate was subsequently transported Fauquier Hospital, where he was treated and released.

The quick thinking, calm demeanor and training of these individuals contribute directly and significantly to the preservation of this inmate's life.


